Helped outfit a new kindergarten classroom with furniture, curriculum, and accessories, as well as obtained a new desk & chairs for the administration office at the RUMC Kindergarten and Preschool.

• Leading teens into adulthood can be quite difficult. Funds were provided to help strengthen student leadership and support the annual Roswell Students Staff Retreat. This is especially important as the staff navigates post-pandemic engagement strategies.

 Helped fund the 1st Annual Friendsgiving Dinner where over 100 students gathered outside the Dod with a 300ft long table to eat dinner. It was awesome! The event nurtures friendships from both the RUMC Student and their guests.

• For hundreds of teens, the Dod is their place to enjoy friends in a safe space. Funds were provided to refresh to the Dod Game Room, making it more enjoyable to the teens, and support the costs around Wet-N-Wild and Mimosa Worship Night.

• Faith can be tested as a college student navigates freedom away at college. Our Roswell Students pastor team was able to visit several RUMC students to help inspire confidence, encourage faith and encourage their purpose.

is a "sister" church to Nuevo Pacto.



• Provided funds to refresh the landscaping at the 846 Mimosa Blvd. property, formerly known as the Coffee House.

 Helped cover the cost for a brass quintet and string quartet to play in the traditional worship service once a month.

• The pandemic increased the dependence on the use of video communication. Video has become increasingly crucial as we continue to look for new ways to be a church community. Therefore, the Foundation purchased a Canon C200 field camera to help the RUMC Communications department keep all engaged.

- Provided funds to make necessary repairs and replacement to the Fellowship Hall stage and railing system for the curtains.
- The sanctuary pipe organ just may be the most experiential item that enhances any worship moment. Funds are annually provided to help make annual repairs to the large sanctuary pipe organ.
 - In 2020, the Foundation funded room sterilization and personal sanitation stands to help make the church facilities be safer from the COVID 19 virus. In 2021, funds continued to provide supplies.


