## Touching every age



- Contributed funds tp RUMCK to help children with special needs and their parents.
- Provided a joyous celebration to the families, teachers and students at RUMC Kindergarten and Preschool's 50th Anniversary.



- Funded the refresh of the Children Ministry's large room where the space is transforming into a fun inviting space for all the children's classes to enjoy large group times and lessons. The grant funds helped purchase new furniture, wall art, teaching tools, accent lights, technology upgrades and accessories.
  - Provided the funding for RUMCK's petting zoo at the Fall Festival, as well as the animals at the RUMC Children's Christmas and Easter celebrations.





- Purchased (41) forty-one bibles that were distributed to the 3rd Graders and the 3-year-old children within the RUMC Children's Ministry.
- Supported the costs of the Altar Your Life (AYL) Weekend event where worship, learning and impact moments help teenagers with their spiritual walk. In 2022 over 170 students attended.
- Helped fund the trip for the Student Ministry staff and pastor to attend the Leading Edge Ministry Conference where pastors gather to share stories, network and learn from each other.

- Supported individuals, couples, and families in need through the loving support of the RUMC Counseling Center. Mental health has been challenging for many, especially around the changes in the modern world; therefore, the Counseling Center is needed more than ever!
- Care-giving for a special needs child, especially as a parent ages and the child becomes an adult, can feel endlessly exhausting and can drastically deteriorate a parent's health. Support was provided to a single mother to give her a Christmas present in the form of financial relief so she can have respite for herself from the extreme exhaustion.
- Funded the start-up of the RUMC Children's Center Parent Resource Center. The plan for the space is to centralize a variety of media resources to help parents navigate their journey and support their children's spiritual path. Visit the soon-to-be Parent Center located in Building B Rotunda.



- Funded the growth and development of the talented RUMC handbell choir under the direction of a master ringer/composer to gain insight, tips, greater skill, team building and more. Congregation is up for a treat in 2023 with performances featuring our handbells.
- Music helps bring all ages of people together. Funds supported the RUMC Worship Art's Sounds of the Spirit concert series which included the Christmas performances, Patriotic concert, the Chapel Series (featuring Jared Hall) and a Classical Concert celebrating the rebuilt organ in a rededication.
- Provided funds for emergency relief into the RUMC Pastor's Discretionary Fund and the Help Fund. Both of these funds provide support to those in great need as determined by clergy leaders.



# Providing improvements to church facilities




- Grant funds enhanced and prioritized replacement light fixtures in the Dod with new safer LED light fixtures. Let there be light!

### and helping congregation and staff thrive





### From the 2022 Chairman Brook Scardina

Over the course of the past 3 to 5years, the Foundation has managed to respectively generate a return of 3.21% and 5.2%. These results have been instrumental in contributing to the growth of the endowments while successfully supporting each specific designation.

This past year (2022) proved to be an extremely challenging period for financial markets with most asset classes experiencing negative doubledigit returns; however, during times like these, investment performance should be viewed over a longer-term time horizon (3-5 years) in order to avoid financial behavioral bias when making investment decisions. Our partners at the Georgia United Methodist Foundation (GUMF) and Wespath have prudently managed our assets for a strong future.

The RUMCF board takes a great deal of thought in helping to advance the strategic and faith-based mission of the Foundation. For example, we are refreshing the 5-year strategic plan to take advantage of opportunities to grow and we obtain more detailed reports from GUMF to be more aware of strategy and results.

I hope the grant stories within this Annual Report warms your heart as it does mine and inspires you to think of your legacy. We have so much to celebrate in the life and body of the Foundation and Roswell United Methodist Church.
